

Summer Camps



With orphanages in Moldova closed for the summer months, summer camps have traditionally played an essential role in the lives of Moldovan orphans. Despite the shift towards foster and transitional homes, many orphans have no permanent home, and summer camps continue to fill the need for recreation, learning experiences, and nutritious meals. During 2021, Save The Orphans sponsored summer camps in Chiperceni, Chisinau, Cricova, and Soldanesti where antitrafficking awareness and the value of education were stressed to hundreds of orphans and impoverished children.

Father Vasilie's Programs for Orphans in Soldanesti



Save the Orphans has partnered with father Vasile Surdu's programs for orphans and poor children since 2012. In addition to his summer camps in Soldanesti, father Vasilie provides a transitional home for boys, and after school programs which supply nutritious meals and resources for children to work on school assignments. At Christmas, he delivers food bags and Christmas gifts to orphans and destitute families in the region.












Save the Orphans volunteers have distributed over 40 food bags to families in Roscana, Soldanesti, Straseni, Ghiduleni and Cricova so far this year. Through your generosity, our 2021 food bag distribution will be double those of 2020. Food bags include staples such as flour, sugar, rice, oil, cereals, canned meats and fish, and household necessities.









Elenas Family of 13 children, including 4 orphans

Elena heads a household with 13 children in the village of Cricova. Her sister passed away from cancer last year, leaving Elena to care for her four orphan children in addition to her own nine children. Through your generous donations, Save the Orphans provides large food bags to Elena's family monthly. We also provide school supplies, backpacks, new clothing, and shoes for the entire family. In past years Elena's children have been treated as inferiors in school because of their worn clothing and shoes. This year each child was thrilled with their new backpack, school supplies, and clothing, bolstering their self-esteem and confidence











The Oak House Women's Transitional Home

Save the Orphans partners with the Oak House, a transitional home, that provides a safe and structured environment for over 20 college-bound orphans.

These women must adhere to strict academic standards. In addition to their educational pursuits, they perform community outreach.







In December, these women will visit orphans and group homes to distribute new winter clothing and Christmas gifts. The Oak House women sing songs, perform skits, and play games with the children to spread the holiday spirit.
