MANY MOLDOVAN ORPHANAGES ARE ON LOCKDOWN AND ONLY A FEW ALLOWED US TO ENTER

Slowly more orphans are being assimilated into transitional homes. During the Summer, Save the Orphan's Local Director, Diana Todica, and volunteers were invited to visit Chisinau's largest orphanage.

They conducted our Christ-centered programs focusing on building a relationship with Jesus Christ, self-esteem, academic and vocational goals. Diana's team, prepared games, skits, Christian songs and delicious meals were provided to the children during the Bible study.

In the villages of Ghiduleni and Roscana, the Mayors also welcomed Diana and our ministry. Save the Orphans provided backpacks, gifts of fresh fruits, biscuits, chocolates, shoes and socks.

Moldovan orphans are forced out onto the streets where they are at a constant risk of being lured and sold into trafficking. We empower orphans with awareness and education that will protect them from human trafficking.

Despite the many challenges of Covid-19 and the Moldovan government's inability to offer relief, Save the Orphans was able to increase its food distribution programs through an expanded network of five local partners.

This allowed for the delivery of a greater number of larger food bags and winter clothing to transitional homes with orphans in the villages of Dubovca, Bozieni, Ghiduleni, Straseni, Soldanesti, Cricova and Roscana.
